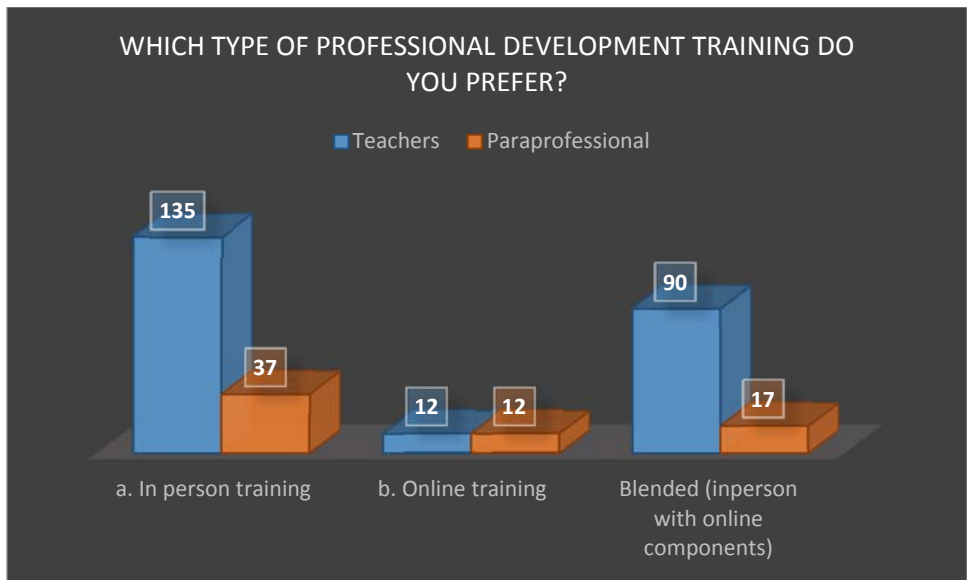
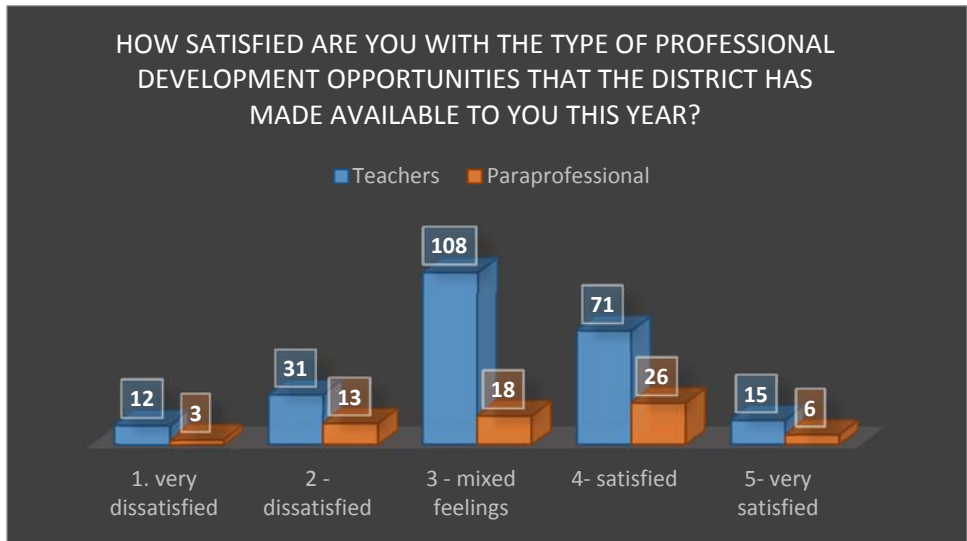

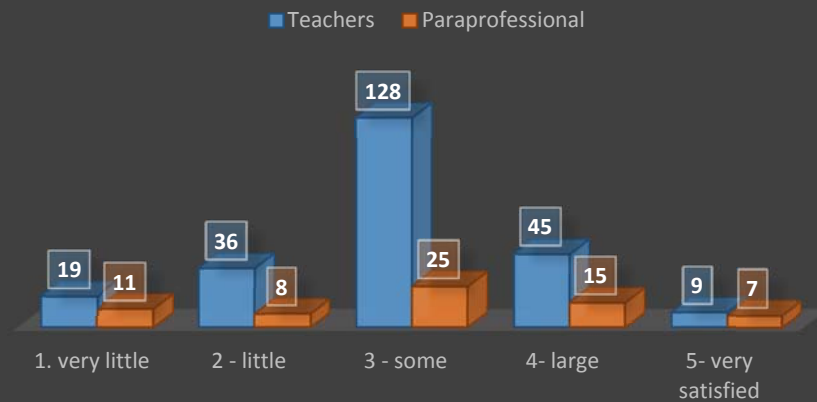
Mrs. Stokes moved, second by Mr. Pappas, to adjourn. On a unanimous vote, the Committee adjourned at 7:02 p.m.

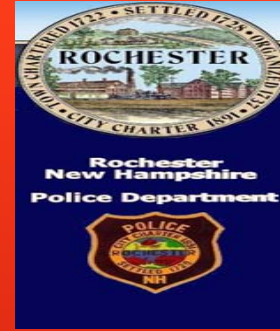
