

## NWEA Target Growth Targets

<p><b>Define the Problem</b> The District seeks to ensure that students are making adequate growth on a regular basis.</p>		
<p>Establish Measures, NWEA Reading and Math Assessments. 75% of the students in grades 2 to 5 should make their Fall to Spring growth targets. The NWEA norms are designed for students to make growth from the Fall to Spring. It is expected the typically, 50% of the students will meet their growth target. High growth districts exceed that target.</p>

<p><b>Implement Changes</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Review the growth target with students in grades 2 through 5; monitor the growth target with Winter assessments on an as needed basis.</li> <li>* Continue to refine Tier 2 and Tier 3 instruction to ensure appropriate programs for students based on data.</li> <li>* Reading specialist and reading teachers in each school</li> <li>* Math teacher in each school</li> <li>* PD focused on improved core reading and math instruction and interventions</li> <li>* Data team meetings focused on individual students and a school wide data team looking at the school's performance.</li> <li>* Individual school plans based on data analysis.</li> <li>* Before and after school tutoring</li> <li>* Summer tutoring involving the use of My Learning Rocks and other technological resources</li> <li>* Learning and instructional engagement plan.</li> <li>* Title I plans in Title I schools.</li> </ul>
