STUDENT INVOLVEMENT IN DECISION-MAKING

A primary task of the school is to create a stimulating learning climate which develops active involvement of students in their education and develops a spirit of inquiry. Students are

encouraged to work together with school staff in such activities as planning and evaluating

school programs.

The Board believes that students should:

1. Feel free to express their own opinions without fear, recognizing that every privilege and right

has a corresponding responsibility;

2. Be involved in the planning of assembly programs and school-sponsored forums of interest;

3. Be encouraged to participate in student government organizations that provide students with a

voice in school affairs; and

4. Be encouraged to participate in a variety of extra-curricular class activities to broaden their

educational experiences.
